POISONOUS PLANTS

Following is a list of the most common plants and flowers that may be deadly for your pet, if ingested. In some cases, only certain parts of these are poisonous, such as the leaves of the tomato plant and not the tomato itself. In general, the pits, leaves and/or foliage of the vegetables and fruits are dangerous; in many varieties of flowers listed, it is the bulb portion that is poisonous. Use this list as a guideline to make your home "safe" and "Secure" for your furry companion. If in doubt about a particular item specified herein, check with a reliable source or complete reference book before allowing your pet access to a potential disaster. Precautions taken today may save a life tomorrow. In the event that you think your pet has eaten something potentially fatal, consult with your veterinarian IMMEDIATELY!!!
